Our Schools RAF Air Cadets recently attended the Cadet Muster to celebrate the 80th Anniversary of the RAF Air Cadets in the UK. RAF Cosford hosted the regional event which attracted cadets from Shropshire, Wales and the Black Country as well as from further afield. It was held on the weekend that should have hosted the annual air show, cancelled for the second year running because of the pandemic. They took to the air in a number of RAF Chinooks and Pumas and learnt about space, science and technology in the amazing showcase involving the RAF Museum. The day, which included visits by several aircraft and a flypast by the Red Arrows, culminated in an 80th anniversary ceremonial event. This consisted of a full day of activities including air experience flying in RAF Chinook helicopters, STEM activities, Virtual Reality Simulators, a visit to the Aviation Museum and a Firearms Display by the RAF Regiment.
